QUESTION 1: What specific targets of Goal 3 of the UN Sustainable Development Agenda will be addressed in this module?

- By 2030, reduce the global maternal mortality ratio to less than 70 per 100,000 live births.
- By 2030, reduce by one third premature mortality from non-communicable diseases through prevention and treatment and promote mental health and well-being.
- By 2030, ensure universal access to sexual and reproductive health-care services, including for family planning, information and education, and the integration of reproductive health into national strategies and programmes.

QUESTION 2: Do patients with lower socioeconomic status report more discrimination compared to patients with high socioeconomic status?

According to Arpey et al., physicians are less likely to perceive patients with lower income as intelligent or independent.

QUESTION 3: Does gender bias most severely affect women and other marginalized genders?

It is often based on prejudices and stereotypes. Gender bias can be conscious, and something someone is aware that they have. Gender bias can also be unconscious, or something a person is not aware of. This is known as implicit bias.

QUESTION 4: Are women more likely to have mental illnesses?
